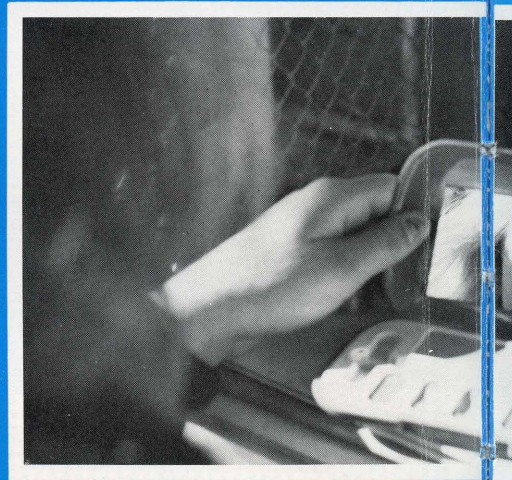

he wants to be.

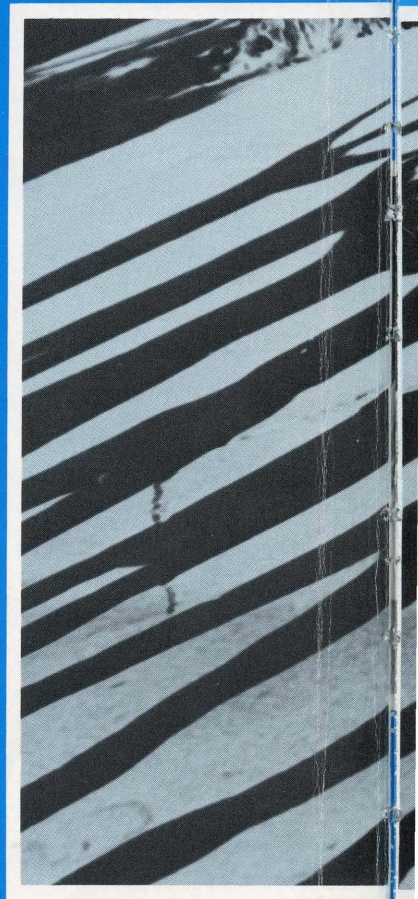

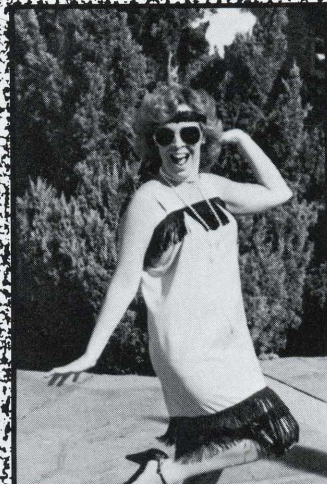




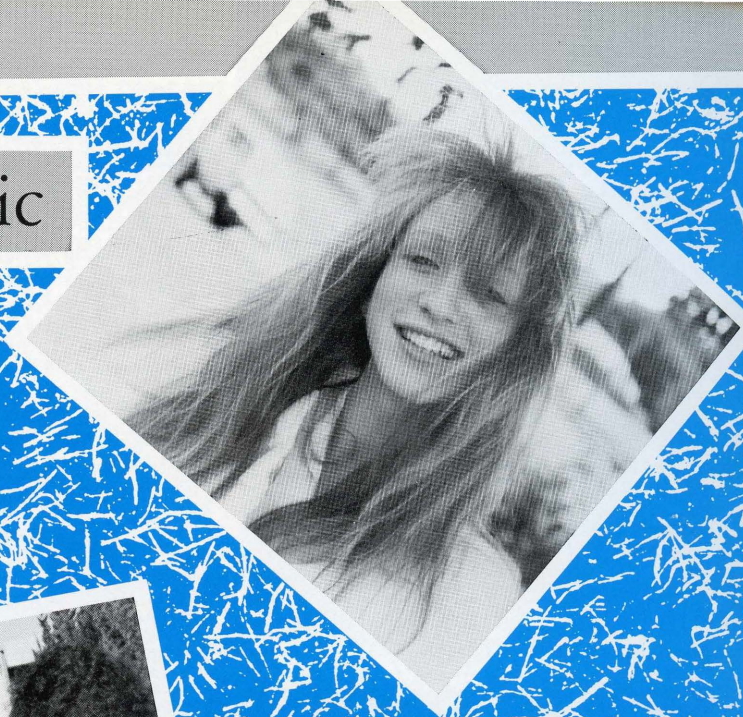
Horrific Halloween

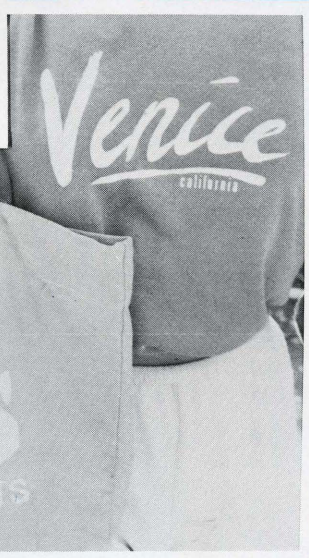

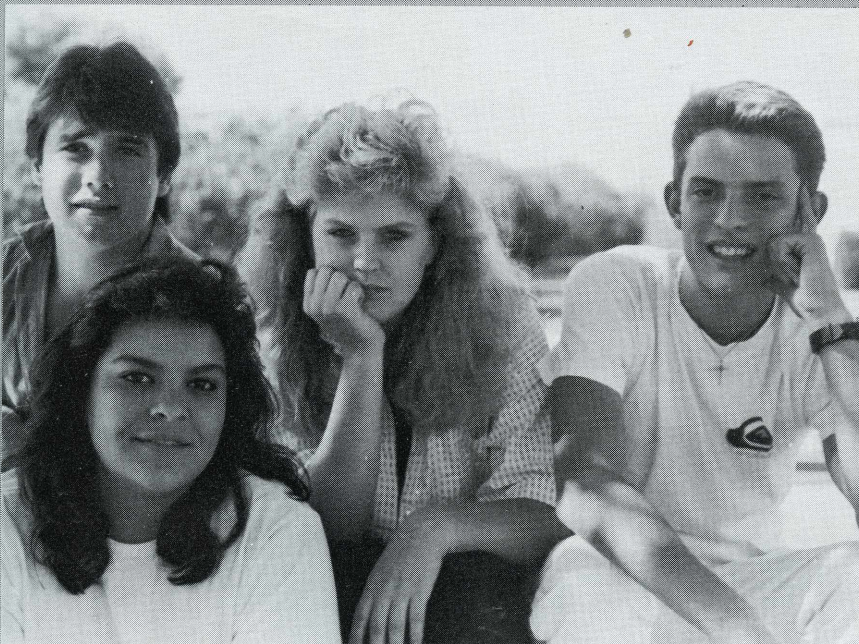
A.S.B.

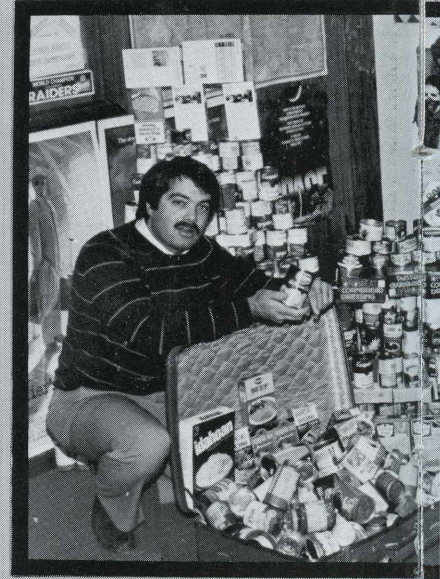

There were many activities this year. Among the favorites were Halloween and the Canned Food Drive.

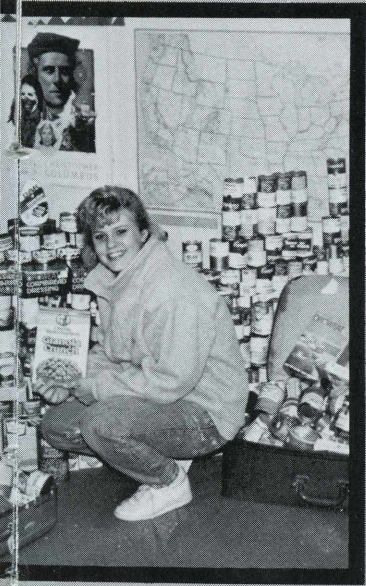

When yearbooks first went on sale there was a drawing. The winner was Stacey West who won a \$50. gift certificate from Tempo Records.



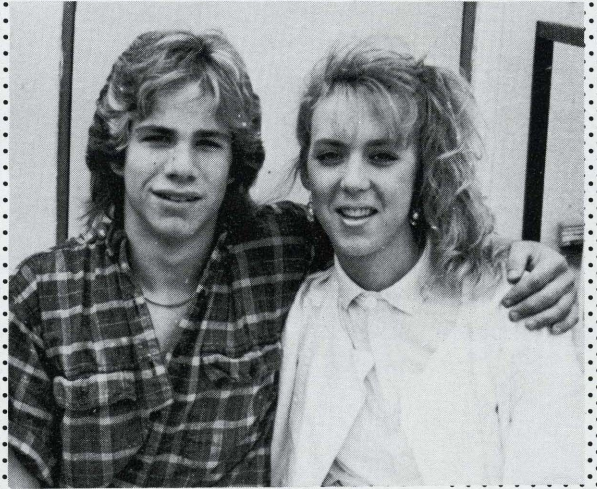
While munching on holiday goodies students and faculty got a surprise visit from Santa Claus. Everyone was delighted to tell Santa what they wanted as they sat on his lap.

There were many other events to make the rest of the year special including the Easter egg hunt, the '87 prom, and Bowman graduation.

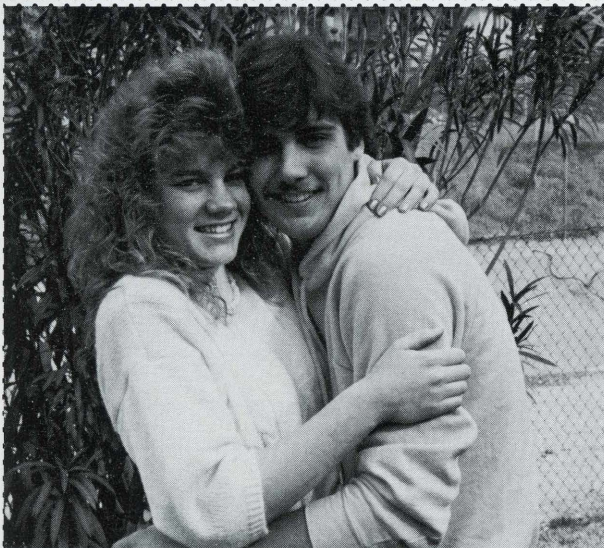

Keith died on September 28, 1986, at age 18.

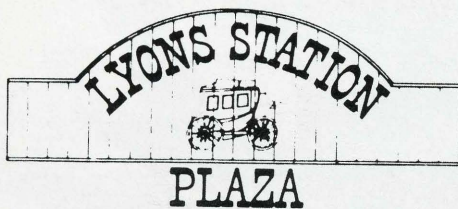
