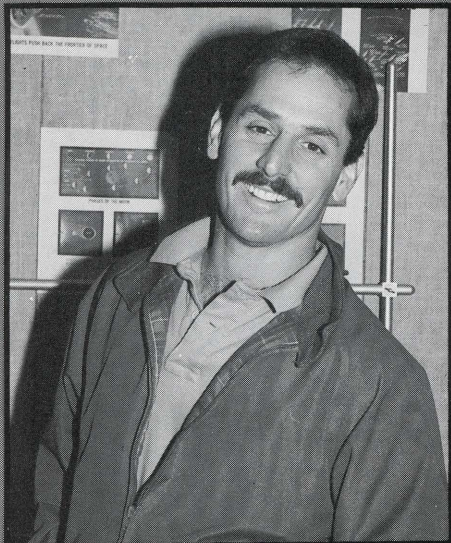
JoAnn Ward - Social Studies

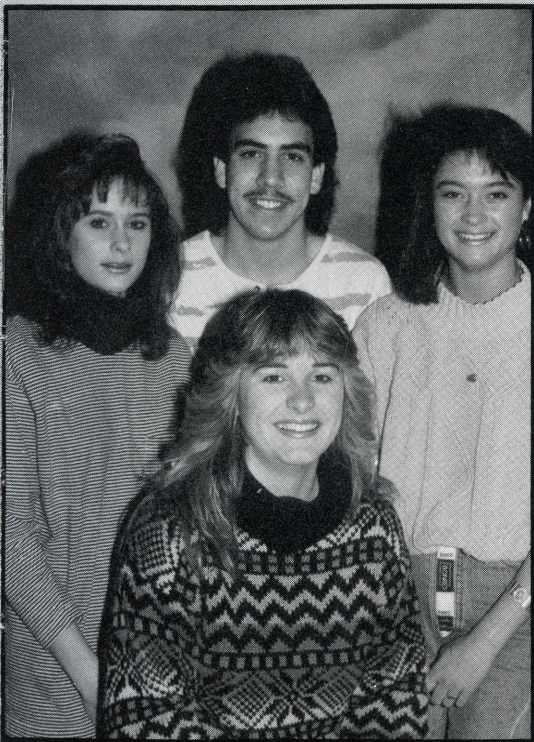
1988-89 A.S.B.

Students must attend one class meeting per week and furnish pay stub verification for credit.

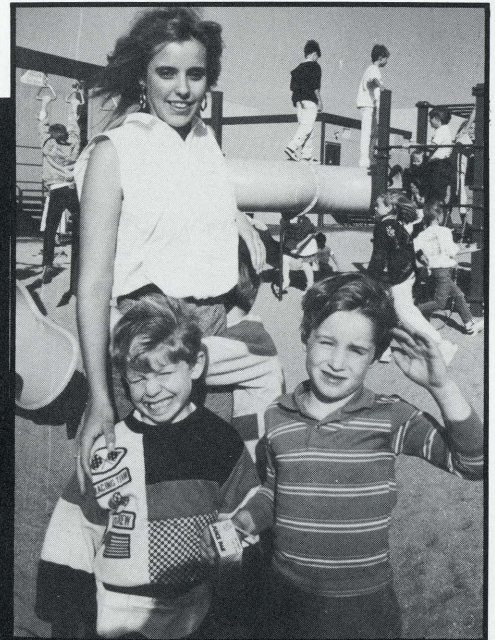
