Generally, there was a very happy atmosphere on campus during the holiday seasons. Holidays really do seem to bring enthusiasm and joy to one and all.




Magic vs. AIDS






SOCCER!!!











The Sophomore and Freshman football teams had exceptional seasons. The Sophomores end up with a record of 5-5 and the Freshman with a record of 8-2.




Issam Sweiss was this year's ASB president. When getting involved in ASB, Issam was look-








