Our beloved Hart Park Superintendent of 30 years or so has advanced in his career as a park professional.

Norm came to Hart in 1986 with enthusiasm, a lot of talent, energy, and a big heart for all things in Hart Park. Norm loves animals and nature of course as he grew up on the family farm in Illinois. The Hart Ranch was a perfect fit. Over 200 acres of buildings, artifacts, animals, fences, stables, trees and everything needed some TLC.

Hart Park did not have a revenue stream then. Norm worked first with county counsel to make a way for rental reservations, the FOHP Gift Shop we treasure today and the fundraising we do now.

In 1987 Mr. Phillips worked to bring back the Natural History Museum to operate Bill Hart's home – the museum of unparalleled historic value.

In 1993 an issue with dangerous farm equipment under the then open "pole barn" arose. Norm made the decision to make the area safe. Then the 1994 earthquake hit and the empty open pole Barn became SCV's DAC (Disaster Application Center). The barn wrapped in sheet plastic served well, but it opened up possibilities. The Hart Hall you see today has changed everything for Hart Park. Thank you Norman Phillips for truly being a Friend of Hart Park,

Every structure is improved, our animals are safer, our gift shop is wonderful. Hart Hall joins our community in so many ways. Today we see Movies in the Park, Cowboy Festival, Art Events, Live Music, Cultural Festivals including

our Hart Pow Wow, the Pacific Islander Festival, Bow Wows & Meows Pet Adoptions, and Silents Under the Stars.

The brand new front and entry to Hart Park segues into Old Town Newhall's revival and SCV Historic Society Preservation efforts. Beautiful brides now have weddings and sometimes family & friends gather together to say one last goodbye to loved ones. Bill Hart would have been so proud of you Norm, for your dedication, commitment, and love of his legacy for our County, our Country and all future generations.
