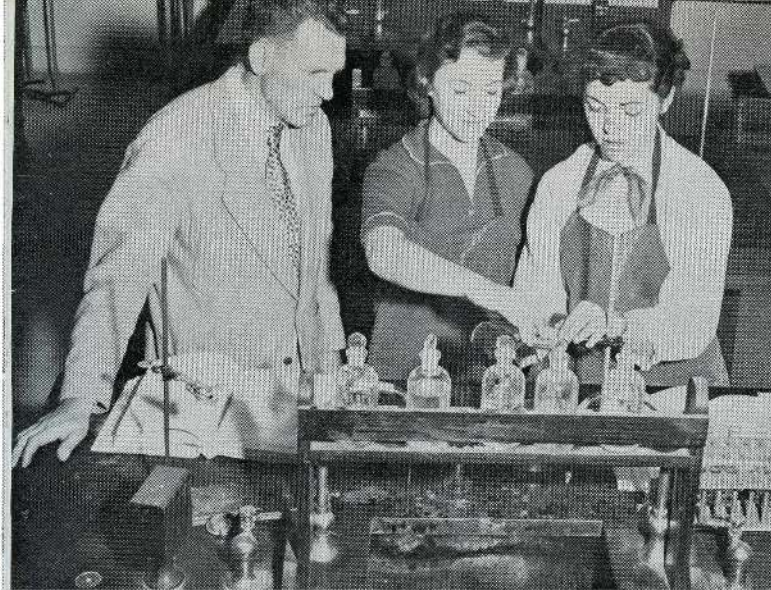

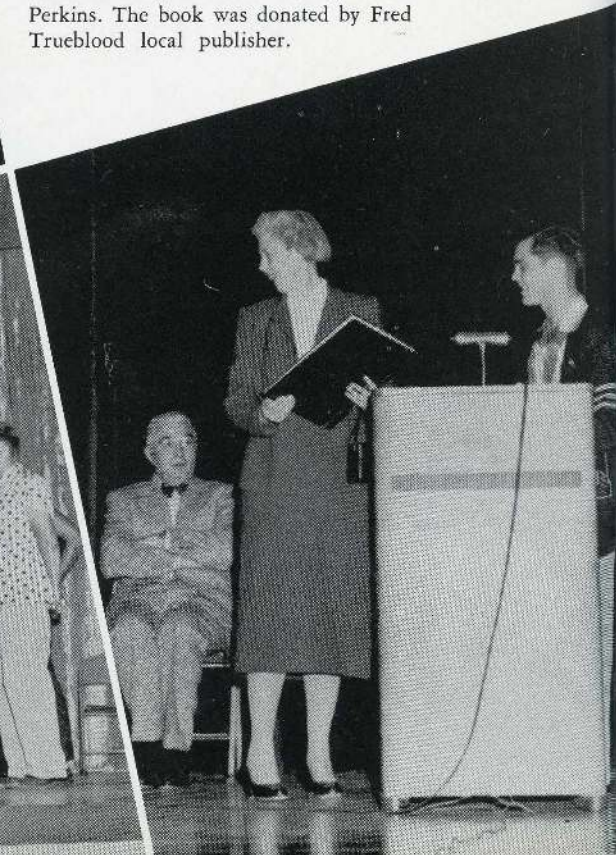

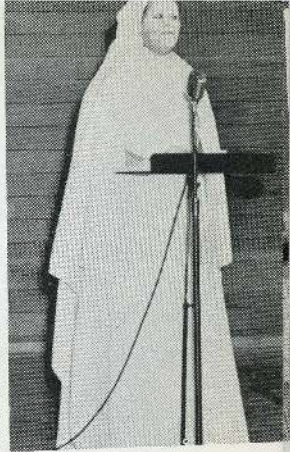

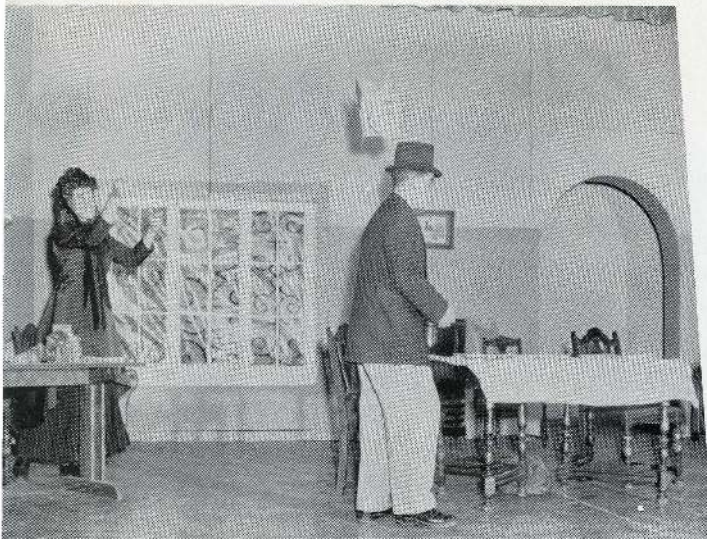

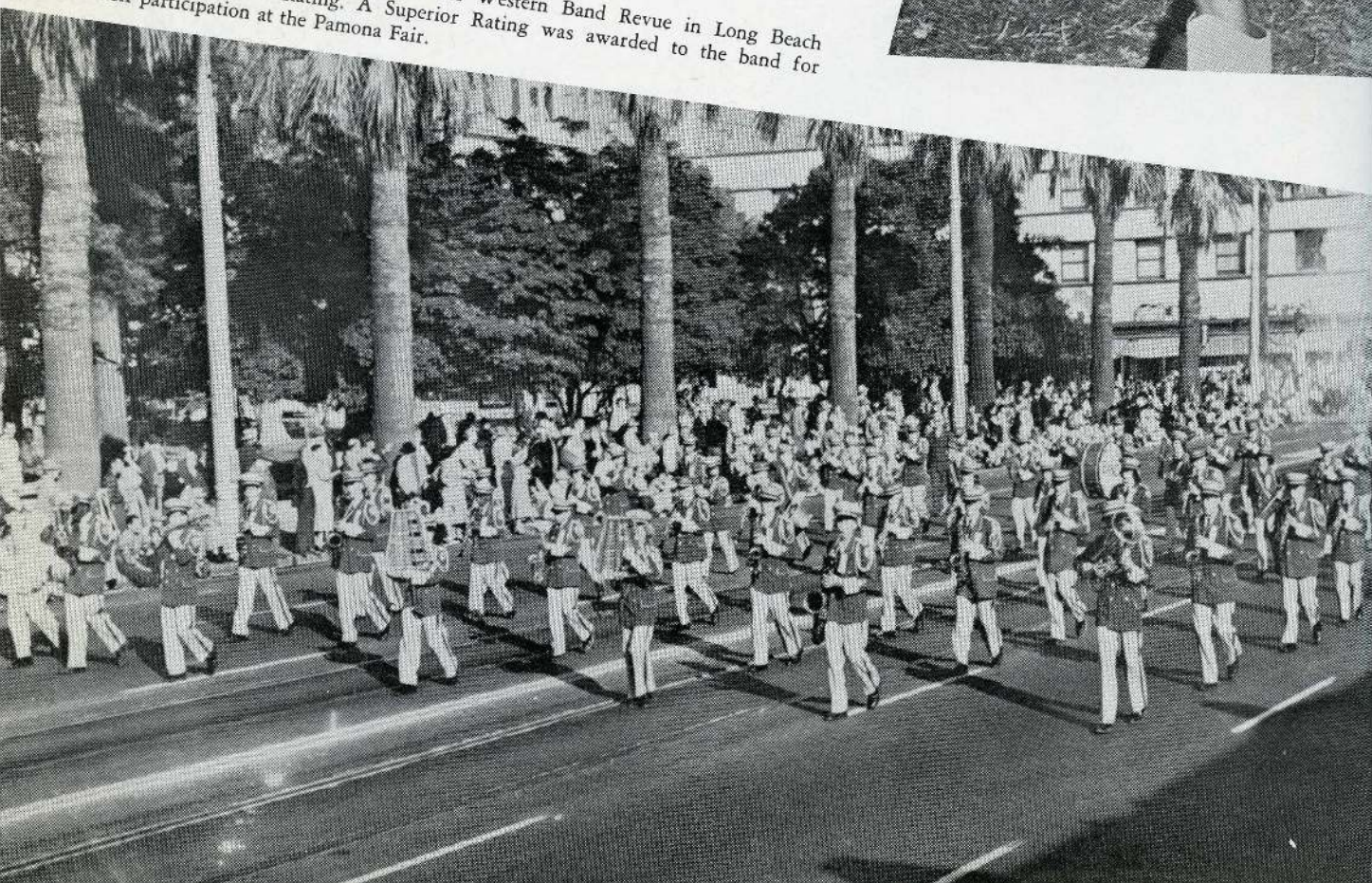
Band
