Austrian daredevil Felix Baumgartner broke 3 records：the speed of sound highest free fall without a parachute and highest platform exit in a skydive over the New Mexico desert． His free－falling plunge started 24 miles above Earth；at one point，he reached over 830 mph ．


Hurricane Sandy swept the eastern U．S．coast with destruction stretching from the Carolinas to Connecticut．It was the largest Atlantic tropical storm on record and caused over 100 deaths and $\$ 30-50$ billion in damages．Homes were destroyed and millions of people were left without power for weeks．

A rare astronomical event called the Venus transit made it possible for people to see the planet as it orbited around the sun. This occurrence lasted over 6 hours and won't be seen again for 100 years.


Energy conservation and sustainability were hot topics in Washington D.C. Natural gas was one energy source that was highly debated. Twenty-five percent of U.S. energy comes from natural gas because it is cleaner than other energy sources. However, the process of getting natural gas can cause water and air pollution.

coral finding in tropical reefs


A new coral species was discovered in the western part of the Coral Triangle. The coral lives on cave ceilings and is unique because it lacks the bacteria that other coral need to survive. It can tolerate low light levels in deep waters and has small polyp sizes, which cause it to grow slowly.


## diamond detergent

At 43.5 mph , Solar Impulse made its historic solar-powered intercontinental flight between Switzerland and Morocco, with a stop in Spain. The plane's 12,000 solar cells across its wingspan captured the sun's energy to run its motors and recharge the battery. The mission demonstrated the potential for pollution-free air travel.

A U.K. team of researchers
discovered that very small pieces of carbon called nanodiamonds can help detergents more effectively clean clothing with cold water. These findings were part of the "Cold Water Cleaning Initiative" that aimed to find energy savings by replacing hot water with cold for household chores.

## my discoveries

What discoveries topped your list this year?

robot plays rock, paper, scissors


Physicists at the University of Tokyo created a robot that can play rock, paper, scissors and win $100 \%$ of the time against humans. The robot was programmed with a high-speed camera that senses human wrist motion in 1 millisecond and determines which move the player will choose before the motion is even made. Someday, similar technology might be used in assembly line work and even in hospitals.


French engineer Luc Fusaro developed customized shoes to enhance athletic performance. First, a digital model is made of the athlete's foot. Then, using special powder with a 3-D printing technique, the shoes are built for a perfect fit. The shoes can improve speed performance up to $3.5 \%$.
the egg \& i


A new egg-shaped car called "Eggasus" joined the eco-friendly vehicle market. The 3-wheel car gives off zero emissions and is ideal for compact, urban spaces. "Eggasus" costs \$5,000 and fits one person inside. It can reach 25 mph and travel a distance of about 50 miles.

## digital pills



The first digital pill was approved by the FDA. The digital chip, the size of a grain of sand, is implanted in a pill that is taken at the same time as the patient's medication. The chip sends an electric signal to a patch worn on the person's skin which sends the information to medical professionals for monitoring.



## the mini



GroundWave Shadow Trainers, a shoe prototype that helps teach people how to dance, was designed by Tom Sykes from Loughborough University. Sensors in the shoes are connected to a smartphone app, which tracks the user's movement and provides feedback. The shoes were created to teach dance and encourage physical activity for kids.

## golf's giants



Four different players won each of this year's major golf championships. Bubba Watson finished 10 under and made both holes in a sudden-death play-off to win the Masters Tournament. The U.S. Open Championship went to Webb Simpson, who earned his 1st major title 1 stroke ahead of his closest opponents. Ernie Els' win in the Open Championship made Els the 8th player to win a major in 3 different decades. Rory Mcllroy won the PGA Championship by a PGA-record 8 strokes.


Dario Franchitti placed first at the Indy 500 to earn his 3rd title. Franchitti drove for his teammate and former race winner Dan Wheldon, who passed away in a crash last year. He wore white glasses afterward in honor of Wheldon.
tour de France


Bradley Wiggins of Britain celebrated a win in the Tour de France and was the first Brit to ever win the race Wiggins beat out 2 nd place finisher, and Team Sky teammate Chris Froome, by more than a 3 -minute margin.


The Indiana Fever won their first WNBA championship against the Minnesota Lynx in Game 4 with a final score of 87-78. Tamika Catchings of the Fever scored 25 points in the final game and earned the MVP award.

## ravens fly to victory

The Baltimore Ravens and San Francisco 49ers faced off in Super Bowl XLVII, which was held in New Orleans. The Ravens took a 22 point lead when the stadium's power went out for nearly half an hour. Once the power returned, the 49ers tried to close the gap in a second-half surge but the Ravens held on for a 34-31 victory. The Ravens quarterback, Joe Flacco, earned the MVP award.

## to the extreme



Los Angeles hosted the Summer $X$ Games with 18 events held over a 4-day period for BMX, Motocross, Rally Car Racing and Skateboard. Bob Burnquist won his 22nd career medal at the Games and defended his title in the Skateboard Big Air. Vicki Golden won gold in the Motocross for the second year in a row, following an injury earlier in the year.

## giant win



The San Francisco Giants won the World Series in just 4 games in the best-of-seven series against the Detroit Tigers. The win marked the Giants' 2nd World Series title in 3 years, the team's 7 th title in the franchise's 129-year history.


## heat trumps thunder



The Miami Heat won the NBA title over the Oklahoma City Thunder in Game 5 with a final score of 121-106. Team leader LeBron James earned the MVP award.


## little league all-stars



The Kitusana All-Stars of Japan won the 66th Little League Baseball World Series against Tennessee with a $12-2$ lead. The game was shortened to 5 innings because of the 10-run mercy rule.


The Sporting Kansas City defeated the Seattle Sounders in overtime to win the men's Lamar Hunt U.S. Open Cup after a 3-2 shootout. The Women's Professional League suspended the 2012 season and then announced it would not return for 2013 due to low attendance and lack of resources.

For the first time in franchise history, the Los Angeles Kings skated off with the Stanley Cup. On home ice, the champions beat the New Jersey Devils in Game 6 with a 6-1 lead. Goalkeeper Jonathan Quick was named MVP.
