Each day of our lives things change all around us, but we do not seen to be really aware of them until enough time passes to make the changes really noticeable.

For instance, since World War II, about twenty percent of the U.S. population has moved annually, and one-third of all families with husbands under thirty-five move each year. It is also nothing new in America that more and more people have moved from farms into the cities, but now we have developed the "megalopolis" as, since 1960, two of every ten rural families have disappeared from the farm scene. Another big change since World War II is working wives and mothers, as worken now represent thirty-four

percent of the nation's work force. Today, early matriage is another significant change. In 1946, only one percent of matried men were eighteen or under, while today that figure is eleven percent. It is also estimated that at least twenty-five percent of today's matried couples will divorce.

In 1940, thirty-five percent of high school graduates went on to college, while in 1965 this figure jumped to fifty-four percent and this did not include specialty schools. This, of course, caused over crowded conditions in colleges and universities and greater pressure on students to get higher grades.

In these times, because of greater knowledge and the new "wondersdrugs," people now live longer and the over 65 population has increased considerably. With this increase, senior citizen developments and countless trailer parks have sprung up all over the country, especially here in the Southland.

With the shorter work week and many new labor-saving devices, people now have more leisure time and many spend it trying to get close to nature as is evidenced each year by the crowds of people who jam into our national parks, causing an environmental threat.

These are only a few of the changes that affect us each day of our lives. As you read and look through the 1973 Nugget, perhaps you will be more aware of what is happening all around you.

Mr. Thornton, below right, now a band director at Hart High, was our band director at Placerita.




Principal's Message






Counselors

Classified Personnel


This group of helpful people includes all the personnel of the school who are not certificated to either teach or administer the affairs of the school.


Social Studies

The picture just below left shows Mr. McGrath with a rap group on the Christmas Activity Day.








The Arts











Special Education







Miner Niners Groove With the Times


A Little Culture — if You Please.


The music department, under the leadership of Mr. Brown and Mr. Christian, has had an active year.

The band, directed by Mr. Christian, appeared in the Christmas Parade in Newhall, at some football games, and several assemblies.



Football and Basketball


