MAKING THE COMMITMENT






Making up and making friends are two very important parts of high school. Without this, high school would only be class after class without any fun in between!




MAKING THE BIG PLAYS




MAKING IT CLOSE




MAKING THE BREAK






















A CAREER BEGINS


