




The new Canyon Country Community Center is a cornerstone of our **Santa Clarita 2020 strategic plan** under the theme of **Building and Creating Community**.




Sheriff's Station

Another major project in **Santa Clarita 2020**, which is creating community by enhancing the efficiency of our partners at the **Santa Clarita Valley Sheriff's Station**, is a brand-new facility. The new Sheriff's Station is taking shape on Golden Valley Road. It will replace the current facility that has been home to our deputies, dispatchers and detectives since the 1970's. On track to open at the end of 2020, this station is centrally located and will provide our deputies with the space they need to provide top-notch public safety services now and into the future.


Homelessness

A major part of **Creating Community** is ensuring that all the members of our community have basic life essentials, like a roof over their heads. To that end, the City and key service providers have been diligently making progress on our **Community Plan to Address Homelessness**. Step one was creating the **Community Task Force on Homelessness**. That Task Force has been formed and is now meeting regularly as a whole and in committees, each tasked with taking on different action items within the plan. Thanks to support from the **City and Fifth District Supervisor Kathryn Barger, Bridge to Home** (the major homeless service provider in our community) has committed to keeping its shelter open year-round. Now those experiencing homelessness will always have a place to go to connect with resources, sleep, shower and begin the transition into permanent housing.

The City of Santa Clarita has long been hailed as the ideal place to raise a family, set up a business and enjoy all the natural beauty Southern California has to offer. Your City is working hard every day creating community!

TRAFFIC SAFETY

a message from the City Manager Ken Striplin



An essential part of **Creating Community** is ensuring residents can move safely and smoothly throughout our community, to get where they need to go, do the things they enjoy doing and to be with the people they love.

The City of Santa Clarita is accomplishing this through infrastructure projects and regular road maintenance. Some of the most notable projects that were recently completed are the **Newhall Ranch Road Bridge Widening** and the **Sierra Highway Pedestrian Bridge**. The Newhall Ranch Road Bridge now offers one extra lane of travel in each direction, plus enhanced trail connections and protected bike lanes.

The Sierra Highway Pedestrian Bridge makes it safer for students at Golden Valley High School to walk to and from school. The project also added improvements to the sidewalks, medians, landscaping and traffic patterns. Left turn pockets allow for more efficient and safe driving through the intersection.

I am pleased to report that the work of our **Traffic Safety Team** once again paid off in safer Santa Clarita streets. The team is comprised of the Sheriff's Department and the City's Communications, Traffic and Engineering divisions. Working together through targeted enforcement, engineering improvements and educational outreach – for the second year in a row there was a significant drop in traffic accidents. We saw our collision rate drop by 14 percent and our injury collision rate by 12 percent. In 2017 and 2018, there were **ZERO** pedestrian or cyclist fatalities.

Please always remember to avoid distractions and follow the rules of the road to help improve traffic safety.

Words cannot express how proud

and fortunate I am to be working alongside the dedicated men and women of our Santa Clarita Valley Sheriff's Station. Thanks to their passion, hard work and dedication, 2018 wrapped up with the lowest crime rate on record for the City of Santa Clarita.



Part One crimes are down 20 percent from 2017.

Part One crimes include homicide, rape, robbery, burglary and arson. This drop is due to the proactive efforts, crime suppression operations and the all-around dedication of our Sheriff's Deputies.

Our deputies are impacting crime through special operations, directed patrol tactics, targeted traffic enforcement, specialized deployments, the apprehension of suspects and public education and awareness efforts. Our local Sheriff's Deputies also focus on being nimble and constantly reassessing the approach to crime prevention to best meet the public's needs.

I want to emphasize that we could not have accomplished the crime reduction alone. I want to thank the community for being our eyes and ears in reporting suspicious behavior and working with our deputies to keep our City safe. There are several simple steps that you as a community member can take to make it much harder for criminals to commit crimes. The easiest target for a criminal is something they have easy access to, such as an unlocked car door or a garage door left open. An even easier target is a valuable left in plain sight. For instance, leaving your purse, laptop or cellphone on your car seat.

Moving forward, together we will continue to build upon our City's reputation as a safe community. I want to say thank you to the entire Santa Clarita Valley Sheriff Station team and to the community for the continued support.

CRIME/TRAFFIC STATS

Thanks to the efforts of the **Santa Clarita Valley Sheriff's Station**, the City of Santa Clarita is experiencing the lowest crime rate in Santa Clarita history! Statistics revealed a **20 percent decrease in Part One crimes from 2017 to 2018**. These figures surpass 2014 statistics, which were the previous lowest on record. Other statistics for 2018 include a 23 percent decrease in robberies, 13.6 percent decrease in burglaries, 28 percent decrease in grand theft autos and 18.8 percent decrease in assaults.

The City continued its **Heads Up** campaign that began in 2017 as an effort to build awareness about distractions on the roadway for drivers and pedestrians. In 2018, the traffic collision rate dropped 14 percent, exceeding the City's goal of 10 percent, and once again there were **ZERO** pedestrian and cyclist fatalities. The City's injury collision rate decreased by 12 percent. 2018 now boasts the lowest traffic collision and injury collision rates since 2001. EV CHARGING STATION AT SANTA CLARITA METROLINK STATION

The City of Santa Clarita is committed to creating and promoting new eco-friendly initiatives for community members to enjoy. In 2018, the City partnered with the **Mobile Source Air Pollution Reduction Review Committee** to install an electric vehicle charging station at the Santa Clarita Metrolink Station on Soledad Canyon Road. Residents can use the **EVConnect** application to pay to charge their cars in 30-minute increments. This charging station furthers the City's efforts to provide residents with green transportation options, and this project supports the **Santa Clarita 2020 theme of Sustaining Public Infrastructure**.



PACE BIKE SHARE PROGRAM

The City recently partnered with Zagster to bring the **Pace Bike Share Program** to Santa Clarita. The current pilot program consists of 50 bikes and 12 bike stations located throughout the City, with hopes to add more in the future. The user-friendly Pace app allows residents and visitors to rent bikes and explore the miles of paved trails in Santa Clarita. The bike share program is aimed at providing residents with a new way to explore the City, while enhancing tourism efforts. Bikes can be rented for \$1 for each half-hour of use. This project supports the **Santa Clarita 2020 theme of Building and Creating Community**.

NEWHALL RANCH ROAD BRIDGE WIDENING





Drivers on **Newhall Ranch Road** between Dickason Drive and McBean Parkway have no doubt noticed improvements in traffic flow and safety for drivers, pedestrians and cyclists. An additional lane for vehicle traffic was added in each direction, while pedestrians crossing the bridge now have a protected walkway. Users of the San Francisquito Creek Trail also have a new trail connection under the bridge, allowing them to remain on the off-street trail instead of needing to cross the street at a busy intersection. This project supports the **Santa Clarita 2020 theme of Sustaining Public Infrastructure**.

SIERRA HIGHWAY PEDESTRIAN BRIDGE

Commuters and pedestrians in Canyon Country know the intersection of Sierra Highway and Golden Valley Road is busy, particularly during rush hour. To increase the safety of pedestrians and allow simpler connections for residents on Golden Valley Road and students walking to and from Golden Valley High School, the City of Santa Clarita partnered with Caltrans to make improvements to the intersection. This includes the installation of the **new pedestrian bridge** over Sierra Highway, the first such bridge in this area of the City. This project supports the **Santa Clarita 2020 theme of Sustaining Public Infrastructure**.

ARCHERY RANGE

The City of Santa Clarita has partnered with local nonprofit group **SCV Archery** to bring a new archery range to the Santa Clarita Valley! The range opened in February 2019 and is located in Haskell Canyon Open Space. The archery range joins a variety of other outdoor spaces for residents to use, and will offer one-on-one coaching and group events. Classes will also be available in the Fall 2019 edition of the *Seasons* magazine. EARTH ARBOR DAY




THURSDAYS AT NEWHALL

This past November, the Woolsey Fire burned through nearly 100,000 acres in both Los Angeles and Ventura counties, destroyed over 1,000 homes and quickly became the most destructive fire in the history of the Los Angeles County Fire Department.

With this incident still fresh on our minds, we encourage all residents to begin planning now for a wildland fire incident that could affect Santa Clarita and its surrounding communities. Our department recently released an updated version of the very successful "Ready! Set! Go!" program, which includes step-by-step planning for various ways in which residents can "harden" their homes in order to prevent ember intrusion during a brush fire, and comprehensive checklists to ensure proper preparations in the unfortunate event we call for evacuations.

Please visit fire.lacounty.gov/rsg to download a copy of the Ready! Set! Go! Personal Wildfire Action Plan. You can also obtain copies of this booklet by visiting your local fire station. Once you have this booklet, please sit down with your entire family to review the program and complete the action plan.



Following the guidelines set forth in the Ready! Set! Go! program will give your home the best chance of surviving a wildland fire incident and will give you and your family some comfort and peace of mind knowing that you have planned ahead and will be prepared to evacuate safely, if necessary.



SAMMY CLARITA IS BACK WITH A NEW BOOK!


