ATTACK ON

September 11th, 2001, a day to remember. A day to reflect upon. As we all sat in front of the television and watched history unfold, we have mental scars that will never fade. We as Americans were attacked blindly and brutally. As a day of remembrance, we shall look back and mourn our losses. Americans across the country will remember our loss. The Twin Towers at the World Trade Center in New York were attacked by hijackers in a Boeing 727. The airplane left Boston and was hijacked by five terrorists, and immediately diverted to New York. Shortly after, another plane was hijacked and headed in the same direction, towards the Twin Towers. The North Tower was hit first, and then the South about 20 minutes later. The hits were extremely devastating, and shocked the entire nation. America was ill-prepared for an act of war such as this. As life goes on, which it must, the world is changed. Everyone in the world is feeling the effects of this tragedy, and many of the will-strong people in that building were average people that had a life, and quite possibly families that will be forever changed. On September 11, 2001, lives were taken that had no reason to be taken, and families were broken that had no intention of being separated. Just after the Twin Towers were hit, the Pentagon was hit by another plane, and then still another plane that many believe was headed for either Camp David or the Sears Tower, crashed in lower Pennsylvania. The towers later collapsed, and as rescuers search through the rubble without giving up hope, we find many, many people that just didn't make it. List of Events

At 8:45 a.m., American Airlines Flight 11 crashed into the face of the north tower of the World Trade Center, about 20 stories below the top of the building.

At 9:03 a.m., the second hijacked jet-United Airlines Flight 175- streaked into the south tower, sending a fireball out the other side. Had 65 people onboard a Boeing 767.

At 9:40 a.m., American Airlines Flight 77, a Boeing 757, crashes into the west side of the Pentagon in Washington D.C. collapsing a side of the building. It was in route from Dulles Airport to LAX with 64 people onboard.

At 9:49 a.m., The Federal Aviation Administration (FA.A.) shuts down airports nationwide.

At 9:50 a.m., Two World Trade Center-the second tower hit-collapses.

At 10:29 a.m., One World Trade Center collapses.

At 10:37 a.m., United Airlines Flight 93 from Newark, N.J., to San Francisco crashes 80 miles southeast of Pittsburgh, in Shanksville, PA.

10-11:30 a.m., Government buildings around the country are evacuated, including the Capitol and the White House. The United Nations closes down. The Securities and Exchange Commission closes all U.S. financial markets for the day.

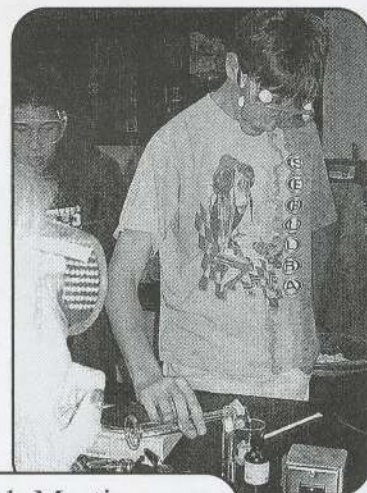

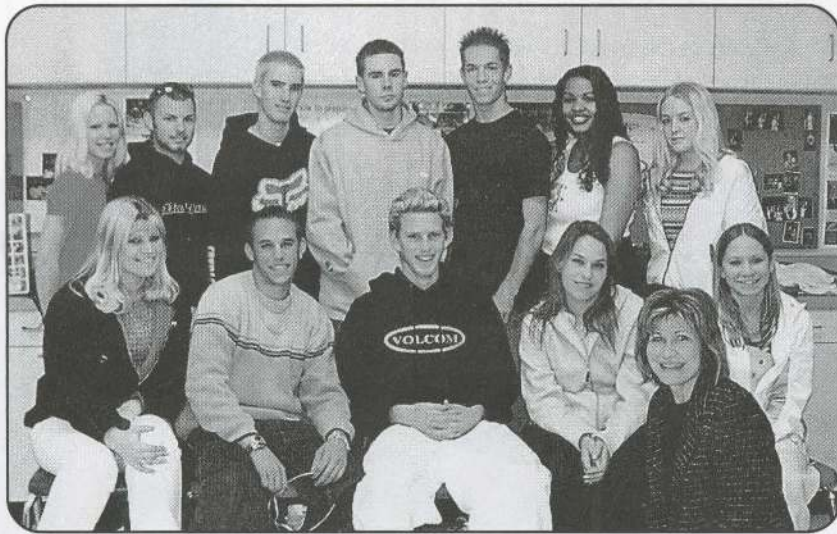

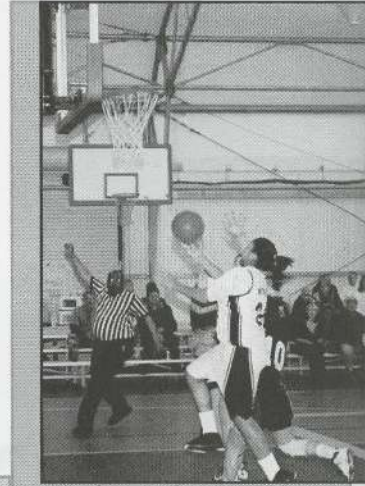

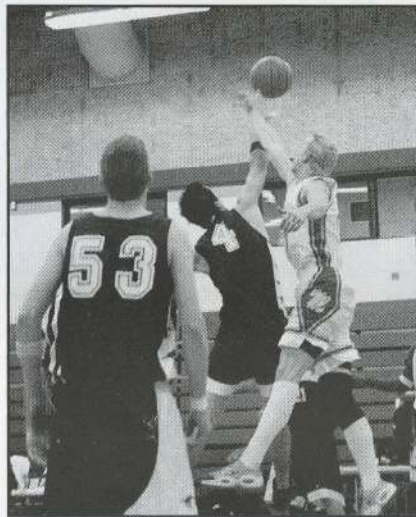

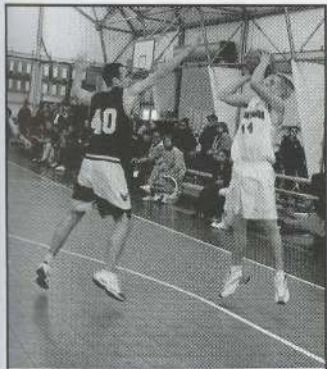

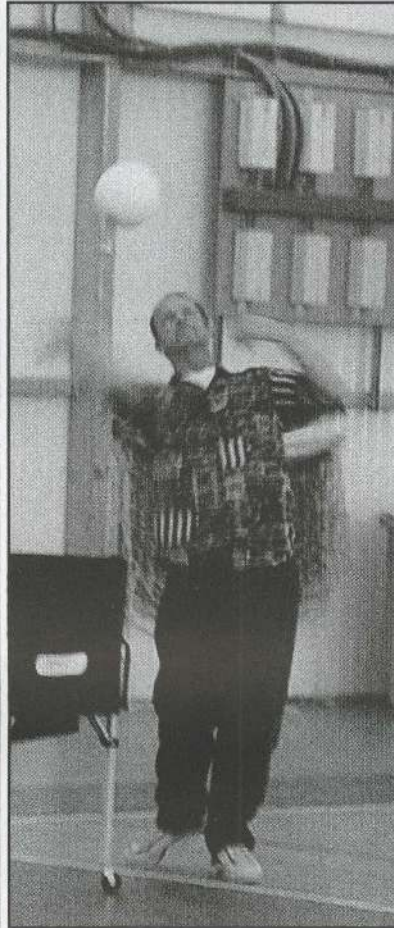

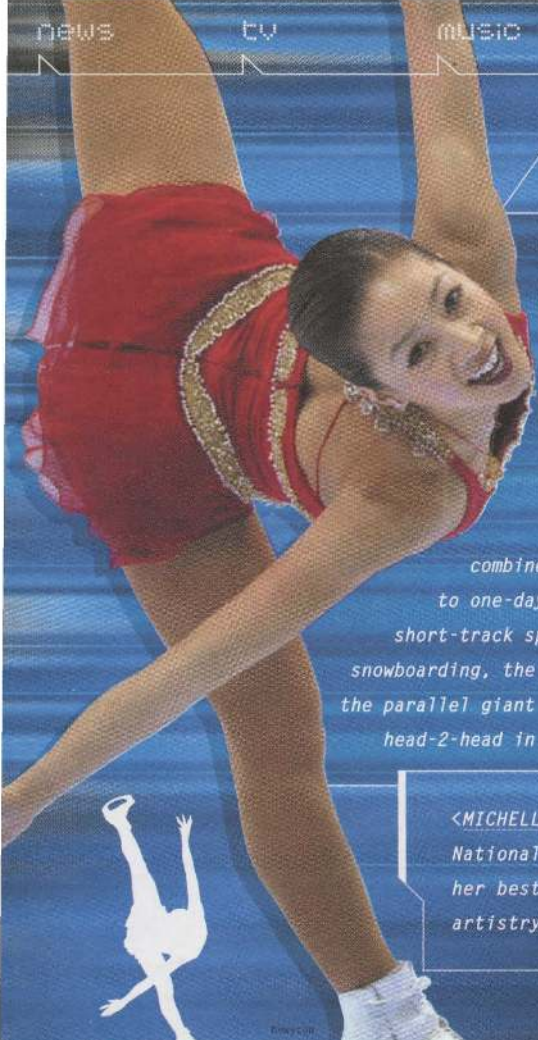


Winter Olympics

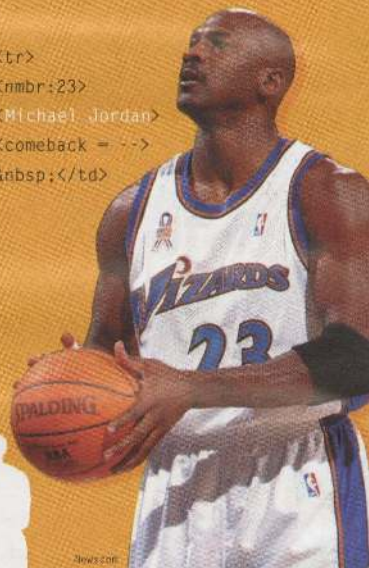

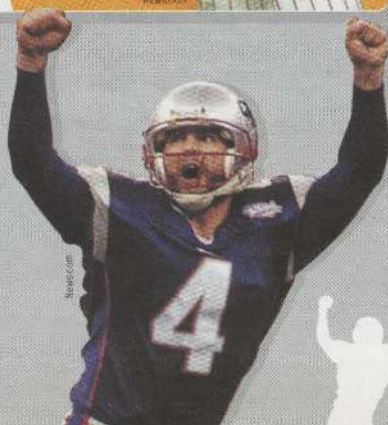
